- 2. Minutes: The August minutes were approved.
- 3. Rick: Treasurer's report:

August income = \$25,939; expenses = \$32,002; YTD income = \$311,991; expenses = \$262,276 Rick has sent a letter to the IRS detailing the refund TGS received and its deposit. Rick does not expect to hear soon from the IRS.

A \$50,000 CD has been renewed for 1 year.

The UCF is valued at \$25,747 as of August 31.

4. Nancy Bowen: Finance team's report.

The Committee approved applying for a Waldensian Grant to help fund the purchase of a new vehicle for the Samaritans. Major capital expenses are behind us and the church is currently in a good financial position.

5. Dennis St. John: Facilities report:

Dennis will check on the delay in receiving the courtyard fence locks. The railing is being painted. Paver repair is still open. Special paver cutting equipment is necessary to shape the pavers to fit. A water filter has been purchased for the ice machine.

Rick reported the Kitchen Team will meet Sept. 17 to inventory the kitchen supplies. Rebecca requested the Team consider coordinating refreshments two evenings for Common Ground on the Border.

Randy announced the neighboring home owners' association will meet in the sanctuary Sunday Sept. 18 at 1:00 p.m.

7. Old Business:
